
Points to consider when using this resource

Students should work collaboratively and will need geometric measuring resources and A3 paper.



Location	The Acropolis, Athens, Greece
Year built	447BC – 438BC
Architects	Ictinos and Callicrates
Designer	Phideas, a famous Greek sculptor
Materials	marble
Dimensions	111 feet x 228 feet or 31m x 70m
Notes	Commissioned by Pericles, the Greek politician credited with the founding of Athens. The Parthenon is a temple to the Greek goddess Athene, patron of Athens

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
