Hampshire’s Tackling Educational Disadvantage Guidance (TED) aims to support the development of an effective whole school strategy for tackling educational disadvantage. It promotes a set of key shared principles at all levels and across key stages, with a strong focus on supporting teachers to use research informed pedagogy in the classroom. The cross-phase, subject specific guidance provides practical examples of how to apply the principles in a subject area, whilst promoting collaboration and alignment of approach across subjects and layers of leadership. The guidance also aims to support collaboration across schools and phases and to assist in securing effective practice at key transition points.
